Town and Country Planning Acts 1990 (as amended) PART OBJECTION TO SECTION 211 NOTICE OF WORKS TO TREE/S IN A CONSERVATION AREA

Address: Acol Court Acol Road LONDON NW6 3AD

Proposal: SIDE GARDEN, ALONG 17 ACOL ROAD: 1 x Privet - Remove. 1 x Cypress - Remove. 1 x Apple - Fell.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 24 August 2011 and decided to **OBJECT** to the following work:

Removal of the Cypress and Apple

Reasons for objection:

1 The trees are considered to provide a decent level of visual amenity within this part of the conservation area. The evidence submitted with the application is considered insufficient to demonstrate the implication of the trees in damage for the following reasons: 1) No roots from the trees were identified below foundations, 2) the Engineer's report concludes there has been no foundation movement and damage is the result of thermal movements between differing building materials, and 3) the monitoring results are from a property in Leytonstone E11 and are not considered relevant.



A Tree Preservation Order has been served on the trees to protect the visual amenity they provide and to preserve the character of the conservation area.

A Tree Preservation Order has been served on the tree/s and no work should be carried out without the prior consent of the Council.

However, the Council would not have any objection to the carrying out of the following works:

Removal of the Privet
