Prune Hornbeam (ID# 13) located at the R/O Raymond according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread by approximately 1-2 metres to provide clearance to building.
- Remove lower branches to a height of 1-2 metres to improve clearance over path.

Prune London Plane (601) (ID# 1) located at the Raymond Buildings (opp 1) according to the following specifications:

- Reduce crown height by approximately 5-6 metres to reduce risk of root failure.
- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune London Plane (610) (ID# 2) located at the Opp 1 Atkin Chambers according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown height by approximately 5-6 metres to reduce risk root failure due to lean.

Prune London Plane (611) (ID# 3) located at the Pedestrian Walk according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown height and balance by approximately 3-4 metres to reduce risk of root failure.
- Thin epicormic shoots, retaining best leaders

Prune Silver Maple (614) (ID# 4) located at the Outside stone chambers according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread by approximately 3-4 metres to provide clearance to building.

Prune London Plane (623) (ID# 6) located at the R/O Raymond Building according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread north section by approximately 3-4 metres to enhance natural form.
- Reduce crown height by approximately 7-8 metres to reduce risk of root failure.

Prune London Plane (631) (ID# 8) located at the Service yard according to the following specifications:

- Reduce crown spread to north and north west by approximately 2-3 metres to enhance natural form.

Prune London Plane (633) (ID# 9) located at the In service yard according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread to south and west by approximately 2-3 metres to enhance natural form.
- Thin crown to remove approximately 15% of live branches to improve light and air penetration through crown. Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Prune London Plane (634) (ID# 10) located at the Theobolds Road according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread to north and west by approximately 3-4 metres to enhance natural form.
- Reduce crown height by approximately 7-8 metres to reduce risk of root failure.
- The prices for these works are based on a week day without the added cost of traffic management.

Prune London Plane (636) (ID# 11) located at the Theobolds Road according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
- Reduce crown spread x2 lateral branches over road by approximately 3-4 metres to enhance natural form.

Prune London Plane (932-940) group (ID# 12) located at the Field Court according to the following specifications:

- Pollard to remove all sprouts from cut ends of branches to maintain size and appearance.

Prune Hawthorn (ID# 14) located at the As per map according to the following specifications:

- Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.
