Assessment

Proposal:

A request for observations to Haringey with regards to an application for demolition of existing sports hall and erection new buildings to provide indoor sports, music and performing arts facilities.

Assessment:

From the borough boundary the only part of the scheme which would be visible is the proposed sports hall, which would be seen between an existing gap in buildings which front Highgate Hill. Given that the building would be 2 storeys with a pitched roof and set well back from the gap on Highgate Hill it is not considered that it would have a significant impact on the street scene or wider Highgate Village Conservation Area.

It should be noted that the high boundary wall surrounding Waterloo Park is directly opposite the application site, with no other buildings within Camden able to view the site directly. The boundary wall is high enough so that the scheme would not be visible from Waterloo Park itself.

The application does not seek an increase in the number of students attending the school and is therefore unlikely to have any strategic impact on Camden from a transport point of view.
