Site Description

The application site is the Brecknock Primary School located between York Way and Cliff Villas. The site contains the main three storey school building with terrace on top and several single storey buildings. The site is not within a conservation area.

Assessment

The proposal is for the installation of vehicular entrance gates to the York Way elevation. The main issues are the impact of the changes on the street scene and on the transport network.

Design

It is proposed to insert double gates to the York Way wall. The wall is 2.1m - 2.5m high and constructed in brick, and partially painted. The gates would measure 2.45 (h) x 4.5m (w) with 1.7m of chain link fencing on top. The gates would be solid steel and painted black, a condition will secure this.

The materials, colour and design are appropriate for the context and location. The height of the gates and the fencing above, would match the existing wall and fencing. As such it is not considered that the proposal would harm the appearance of the street scene and would comply with policies CS14 and DP24 of the LDF.

Transport

The proposed gates would only be used for emergency purposes and occasional maintenance such as cleaning gutters and replacing high level lights. They would open inwards and not affect the use of the footway. Although the access would be within 1m of a lamp post and 9m north of a zebra crossing, the Council's Transport team do not object to the proposal due to the occasional nature of the use.

The proposal would require the formation of a vehicle crossover and a separate application for the crossover will be required. As the highway outside the school is maintained by LB Islington as part of a maintenance agreement, Camden would not make any decision about the construction of a crossover in this location. Islington's Highways Management are satisfied that, as the crossover is more than 8m from the crossing and the proposed use is for emergencies and occasional maintenance which would restrict the use of the gates to about once a month, the proposal would not harm the operation of the highway. A condition will limit the use of the new entrance to emergency use and occasional maintenance purposes.

Recommendation: Grant Planning Permission
