REPORT OF FINDINGS FROM PUBLIC CONSULTATION ON NEW BUILDING PROPOSALS

On Saturday 18th September between 11.00am and 5.00pm a public consultation was held to exhibit the new proposals for Plot 10. The event was held at the existing Plot 10 premises; all parents were invited and invitations were sent extensively to local residents, to visit the exhibition and comment on the proposals.




Invitations as shown above were sent to parents and local residents prior to the event: comments sheets were provided with the invitations to allow residents who were unable to attend to have their say.

THE EXHIBITION:

A Powerpoint presentation and three large posters were exhibited as shown overleaf showing:

- Proposed new layout plans
- Phases in which the project would evolve
- 3D aerial views of the proposal







POSTERS EXHIBITED AT PLOT 10


COMMENTS RECEIVED FOLLOWING THE EXHIBITION

The event was extremely successful with a large number of parents, residents and local children turning up to voice their opinions.

The Comments sheets provided at the event asked visitors three questions:

- Did they like the new proposals? YES or NO, if not why not?
- Would they prefer a 2-storey development?
- Overall do they support Plot 10's objectives?

FIRST QUESTION: of the comments returned, 265 replied YES to the first question, while around 9 people were slightly ambiguous or undecided.



SECOND QUESTION: visitors were asked whether they thought the proposals should be twostorey, allowing for the inclusion of quiet rooms for art, therapy, one-to-ones, computer and community use. Only two people expressed a preference for a single storey building, however they did not state reasons behind their preference; a few were indifferent, but the remainder were in favour of the two-storey proposal. Feedback from the comment forms shows that in particular the girls wanted the quiet space upstairs to be able to get away from the noise in the larger spaces so that they could do art and have smaller group sessions.

THIRD QUESTION: there was a unanimously positive response to the third question concerning Plot 10's objectives.

ANALYSIS OF THE COMMENTS:

Large numbers of the comments received were positive in support of the proposals, without a further statement. However a number of visitors did make valuable comments and a representative selection is set out below:

I hope is isn't too late to comment on the Building Proposals. Sorry I missed the deadline. My comments are: Plot 10 definitely needs more secure office space to ensure confidential information is stored appropriately. In my opinion the office area should have limited access for staff only and access to the area where the children play should also be stictly limited. The new design would provide an area for parents to sign their children in and out in a more organised manner and not crowd in to the space where the children are. This will also provide greater security for staff, children and data. The current building does not look child friendly and welcoming, it doesn't have much natural lighting and the inside space is open plan. It can be noisy and cramped when it is wet outside and everyone has to play inside. The expansion of the inside space will greatly benefit the children and staff as activities can be allocated to designated areas and a quiet area used for reading or doing homework, could be partitioned off if sufficient space were available.
