- The report contains two paragraphs which were not amended to correctly describe the evolved proposal that was submitted for conservation area consent and planning permission.
- 2 A revised version of the report has now been produced.

Paragraph 4.9

3 This paragraph is amended as follows:

To either side of the central five bays a set-back brick wall rises behind the towers, separated from their rear wall by a gap. It contains at fifth floor the same narrow windows as to the central bays at fifth floor. A further set-back sixth floor level is clad entirely in a brick material, in the manner of traditional roofs.

Paragraph 6.15

4 This paragraph is amended as follows:

The design of the new rear elevation relates subtly to that of the Euston Road elevation in its use of materials, in the use of the tall, narrow window device at upper level, and in the implied classicism of the symmetrical arrangement of two pairs of window bays either side of the central pair of slightly wider window openings. An example of the well-poised nature and balance of the proposed design is that it presents itself in this way, but an over formality that would be inappropriate to such a minor street is offset by the asymmetry of the stair position within the central pair of window openings. This design is far more harmonious and visually attractive than the bluntness and uniformity of the present façade.
