Introducing our Play Centre & Nursery

Introduction

The new building proposed at Fortune Green Play Centre is being built to house the existing play service provision and a full time voluntary sector nursery.

The project has come about for two main reasons. Firstly that the West Hampstead area review has identified that there is a need to rebuild the facilities at the play centre as they are past their useful life and to improve the facilities and maximise their use by the community. Secondly a voluntary sector nursery (Sington Nursery) is being temporarily housed in a church hall due to the planned demolition of their existing accommodation. This is due to the plan to build a new school on the site of the nursery to allow Emmanuel school to expand form half form entry to one form entry. The rebuilding of the play centre building on two floors will allow a full time nursery to co-locate on the Fortune Green play Centre site.

The project is being funded by a number of sources including Camden's Primary Capital Programme. It will also receive funding from Property Services as it has been identified as a high priority in the West Hampstead area review.


Location of the centre:

The play centre is located between Fortune Green Open Space, Hampstead Cemetery and a large housing development at 53 Fortune Green Road. Limited service vehicle access is via a service road off Ajax Road which is a quiet residential road.

Pedestrian & Centre entrances:

There are is a shared pedestrian access and vehicular access to the site from the service road that runs alongside Fortune Green off Ajax Road.

Transport links:

The only direct access is by bus route 328, the bus stop is a one minute walk away.

Buses:

There are two bus routes within a five minute walk from the play centre, numbers 328 and C11, they both link in with school opening and closing times.

Trains/Tube:

There is one underground and two overground stations all within a 15-20 minutes walk.

The stations are West Hampstead tube station on the Jubilee line, West Hampstead station on the First Capital Connect service that runs between Luton and Croydon and West Hampstead station on the overground line between Richmond and Stratford.

Roads:

Fortune Green Road is about a minute walk from the play centre and Finchley Road is about five walk away.

Accessibility

Changes in modes of transport are needed as there is only one bus service that provides direct access to the play centre, but the train stations are accessible on foot as described under trains/tube.
