Site Description

Grade I listed museum building situated on the north side of Great Russell Street within the Bloomsbury Conservation Area. The original portions of the building date from 1823-47 and were built to the designs of Robert Smirke. Constructed of Portland stone it was originally planned as a big quadrangle with an open central courtyard. The building consists of two principal storeys and adheres to the Greek Revival style in the most part. Various additions, most recent of which is the Norman Foster designed Great Court scheme which created a central glass covered space around the Sidney Smirke designed Reading Room dating 1852-57.

As the draft LDF Core Strategy and Development Policies documents have now been published, they are material planning considerations. However, as a matter of law, limited weight should be attached to them at this stage.

Assessment

The South Cloakroom is currently used as a cloakroom area and shop. On the wall at a higher level are slate benefactor panels which are located between each pilaster. Below this is a continuous MDF information panel which projects beyond the line of the pilasters. The existing MDF panels would be cut down in size and mounted between the pilasters. Two new panels incorporating monitors would replace the two central panels. This would create a much neater appearance with the vertical lines of the pilasters respected.

In the north entrance two more panels would be mounted on the pilasters. These have been specifically designed to leave the skirting and capital exposed. It was not possible to locate the units on the floor as it is paved in stone which would be damaged by such works. In the proposed location they could be removed in future with the only work of making good being repairs to the plasterwork.

The monitors would provide information on events and exhibitions in the museum and would not be used for more general advertising.

The proposed monitor screens would provide valuable information to visitors to the museum and have been located by the two main entrances. Their positioning is considered acceptable and strikes an acceptable balance between the preservation of the special interest of the building and its successful operation as a museum. It is recommended that consent is granted.
