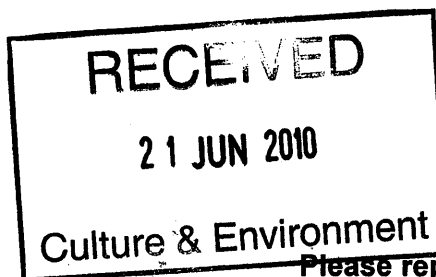

**Address:** St Johns Wood Barracks, 2 And 6 Queen's Terrace, Ordnance Hill, London, NW8 6PT,

**Proposal:** Demolition of existing Barracks buildings (except for the listed Riding School) and redevelopment for residential use (Class C3), to provide a total of 133 units (including the conversion of the upper floors of Nos. 2-6 Queen's Terrace). Use of the listed Riding School as a private leisure centre with internal and external alterations. Creation of landscaped areas and reconfigured vehicular and pedestrian access together with associated works including the provision of parking, circulation space, servicing and plant areas.(Revised Scheme C ).This application is accompanied with an Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA).

The City Council has received an application for planning permission for a development which is described in brief above.
