This document records the building as it existed upon closure in February 2007 and prior to the refurbishment and alterations planned to commence in June 2008. It charts the historical development of the building, explaining and illustrating the significant parts, but also comparing its relative context to similar buildings of its time.

It is anticipated that upon completion of the refurbishment, this Grade II listed building will be significantly enhanced and provide for a secure future over many years.




