10 PERCEVAL AVENUE, NW3 - PLANE TREE

With reference to our telephone conversation today I enclose a copy of two pages of photographs of the roots and a location plan.

I confirm that the engineer has a problem with the foundation designs as the roots are very close to the surface and the floor level is close to ground level.

My assessment is that the cutting of roots shown in the photographs on a tree of this size would not cause any damage. Some pruning is needed over the public highway and the garden and a limited crown thinning would be beneficial. This would balance the root loss.

I would be pleased to hear if you agree with this. If so, the application will be accompanied by a tree protection plan showing ground protection during the full course of construction. Piled foundations can still be used if you find this preferable to strip foundations.

Please let me know if you have preferred pruning requirements and these details will also accompany the planning application.
