Proposed Work:

**REAR GARDEN ALONG TEMPLEWOOD GARDENS:** 1 x Cedar - Crown raise by removing the five lowest branches and remove the deadwood and the dead loose ivy.  
1 x Sycamore - Crown raise by 4 meters & crown reduce by 3-4 meters, remove deadwood & reshape to leave a natural outline.

(ASSOCIATED TREE APPLICATION Ref: 2009/3580/T

(TPO Ref: 15H) **FRONT GARDEN:** 1 x Birch - Crown reduce by 2 meters, remove deadwood & reshape to leave natural outline. Crown raise where it hangs low over the hedge and bamboo.

**REAR GARDEN ALONG BOUNDARY WITH 1 TEMPLEWOOD AVENUE:** 1 x Birch - Crown raise to 4 meters.


The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 15 July 2009 and does not wish to object.
