NO OBJECTION TO SECTION 211 NOTICE OF WORKS TO TREE/S IN A
CONSERVATION AREA

Proposed Work:

OUTSIDE 17-24 FRONT: 1 x Ash: repollard back to main trunk knuckles.

1 x Amelacnier spp - Reduce lateral crown spread, lift balance and clean out crown.

1 x Common Crab - Lift and balance crown.

OUTSIDE 1-8 LEFTSIDE BOUNDARY: 1 x Buddleia - Fell to ground level and allow to regrow or Fell to ground level and grind down stump.

1 x Elder: Reduce and re-shape crown by up to 50%. Lift all round by 1-2m.

REAR OF 73-78:

1 x Laurel - Reduce all round by 25-30%.

REAR OF 63-72: 1 x Cherry - Reduce and reshape by 20-25% clean out and balance crown, remove deadwood, lift canopy by 1-2m.

1 x Common Crab Apple - Reduce and reshape by 20-25%, balance crown.

REAR OF 43-52: 1 x Laurel - Reduce all round by 25-30%.

REAR OF 33-42: Eucalyptus spp - Reduce in height by 50%.

The Council has considered your notification of intended works to trees dated 15 July 2009 and does not wish to object.

- 1 This notice is valid for 2 years from the date of this letter or until the work is completed, which ever is the sooner.
- You are advised that the appropriate standards for tree work are set out in BS 3998: 1989. Failure to ensure that the proposed works are carried out to these standards may result in damage to the tree(s) and may result in legal action by the Council.
- Please note that any approval given by the Council does not give an exemption from the requirements to comply with the Wildlife and Countryside Act 1981 (as amended), or any other Acts offering protection to wildlife.
