<b>Site Description</b>						
<p>The application site is a multi-storey 1907 classical building with some late 20C rear and rooftop additions. It is in use as an education building part of UCL Medical School. It was listed grade II in 1990 and is within the Bloomsbury CA.</p>

## Assessment

Permission is sought for works of upgrade and refurbishment to internal common areas including main entrance, corridors, stairs and toilets to provide new reception facilities and internal security gates, the relocation of a basement toilet to the ground floor, removal of internal partitions and installation of external handrails and lighting to main entrance on University Street.

### Design-

The main works are focused around the entrance foyer and main stair area. These spaces, which retain a high level of original features and facing material, are amongst the most significant internal spaces with regard to the special interest of the building. Internally the historic and architectural interest of the building is focused in the entrance lobby and some principal rooms including the grand library. Much of the rest of the building has seen 20C institutional refurbishments and building regulations upgrades of poor architectural quality.

The entrance foyer works relate to the provision of turnstile barriers and a new reception area. Of interest is an historic wind lobby which has been modified previously to add and then remove revolving doors. The historic part of this element will be retained by the proposal, with the replica internal doors (not in original position) removed. The proposal involves two openings in original walls, one for a door and the other for a reception counter. These are in areas of little surface treatment significance. The turnstiles are to be fixed to flooring which has previously been altered in relation to former lobby works.

The existing marble floor in the foyer would be retained apart from a damaged and worn 1m wide section next to the door, which would be replaced with an entrance carpet, and a non-original UCL logo in the centre of the floor to be replaced with marble to match. This is considered a reasonable approach to refurbishing this space.

Other work includes new entrance handrails and lamps and display cases in former staircase window reveals (internalized as a result of existing rear extensions). Details of handrails, lamps, display cases, doors, reception desk and roller shutter and new soffits have also been submitted and are considered acceptable.

The proposals are considered respectful to the character of the listed building acceptable subject to a condition requiring a method statement for the repair of alabaster surfaces.

**Access-** Wheelchair access has already been approved under a previous pp (see above). The proposed handrails and lighting to the front main entrance is considered an improvement and acceptable.

**Amenity-** There are no other amenity issues raised as part of this application.

It is therefore recommended to grant planning permission and listed building consent.
