ARCHIVE PHOTOGRAPHS FROM 1933 and 1934

The following photographs are from the London Metropolitan Archives.

They show four views from the ridge east of Kenwood House, looking towards Caen Wood Towers, from a series of panoramic views taken in 1933. These give glimpses of the tower, gables, chimneys and roofscape of the house, and indicate how important these features were in distant views. There are also views of the model farm buildings and parts of the west gardens.

The second sequence shows four views from Hampstead Lane, looking east towards the house. These were taken in 1934. The first two show the tower rising over the trees to the east of Kenwood, taken from an unknown elevated viewpoint. The second pair show different views from just outside the walled boundary to the house. The conservatory with its glazed barrel vault is clearly visible, and the top of the glasshouses can be seen above the north end wall of the service courtyard. Clearance of the glasshouses must have occurred shortly afterwards as they are not shown on the 1935/6 Ordnance Survey Map revision.
