The Hall is let to the St Mary Community Halls Committee, a charity and a limited company who have a lease with 15 years to run. The Hall Committee was informed of the proposed work at the start of this month and is content for the work to proceed.

As discussed with Charlie Rose, the firm of roofers being used was recommended by the Quinquennial architect for the Church, who has used them before on heritage sites. Their quotation details the materials that they will be using.

We have booked them to start work in January 2010 – allowing us time to obtain Listed Building Consent. The roofline of the building will be unaffected by the proposed work and all materials used will be in keeping with the historic character of the building. It is not proposed to change the look of the building at all but simply to renew the roof in order to secure the future of the building.

We are fortunate to have secured all the funds necessary for the works to begin.
