# **Relevant History**

2009/2258/P — planning permission granted 30 June 2009 for External alterations to include the raising of parapet and amendments to detailing and fenestration to all elevations, enlargement of dormer windows at second floor level and various alterations to windows on all elevations to residential dwelling (Class C3) as a revision to planning permission 2007/3397/P for the "Erection of a building comprising basement, ground, first floor and roof storey for use as a single-family dwellinghouse (following the demolition of existing single dwellinghouse)" granted on 22/11/2007.

### **Relevant policies**

#### **Assessment**

Condition 1 of the planning permission requested a sample panel of the facing brickwork. This has been provided and viewed on site. It is proposed to use a handmade multi stock for the main body of brickwork, with a red stock for dressings and detail. The colour and texture of the submitted bricks is considered to be acceptable in the context – there are a number of Neo-Georgian buildings in the area, which are building in brown or multi stocks. The brickwork will be laid in Flemish bond with recessed pointing.

The details submitted are considered acceptable in the context of the approved building and the wider St John's Wood conservation area, and approval is recommended.
