THE PROPOSED REMOVAL OF THE EXISTING TIMBER STUD CONSTUCTED PARTITION AND THE INSTALLTION OF A SET OF BI-FOLDING SLIDING PARTITION DOORS WITHIN THE NEWLY FORMED OPENING

We act on behalf of the Religious Society of Friends (Quakers) and specifically their building at 173 – 177 Euston Road, known as Friends House.

We have been asked to obtain listed building consent for the removal of the existing lightweight timber stud constructed partition that currently separates Rooms 11 & 12 at ground floor level, located close to the southwest corner of the premises adjacent with Endsleigh Gardens.

It is proposed to install timber bi-folding partition doors within the newly formed opening that replicate those already installed, which currently separate Rooms 10 & 11.

The proposed works would in effect result in restoring these rooms to there original open plan state, as Rooms 10, 11 & 12 originally formed the Small Meeting House back in 1927 and the open plan layout remained until the 1980's when it was subdivided to forms Rooms 10, 11 & 12.
