The Jewish Museum: Letter of Support for Heritage Lottery Fund Application

As National Chairman of the Council of Christians and Jews, it has been my privilege over the last four years to have become increasingly involved in the life of the Jewish community in Britain.

As a result, I am even more aware of the need that there is to create understanding between people of different races and religions in order for our society to remain civilised, tolerant and open.
