#### Proposal:

Demolition of ground floor rear wing of laundrette and erection of new basement and two storey dwelling house with rear entrance from Camden Mews and internal courtyards; conversion of first and second floor maisonette to 2 x 1-bedroom self contained flats and alterations to shopfront to include new residential entrance to upper floors.

The Council has considered your application and decided to grant permission subject to the following condition(s):

Condition(s) and Reason(s):

The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the end of three years from the date of this permission.



Reason: In order to comply with the provisions of Section 91 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 (as amended).

All new external work shall be carried out in materials that resemble, as closely as possible, in colour and texture those of the existing building, unless otherwise specified in the approved application.

Reason: To safeguard the appearance of the premises and the character of the immediate area in accordance with the requirements of policies S1/S2, B1 and B7 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

Prior to the erection of the building, a plan, showing details of the green roof (including species, planting density, substrate and a section at scale 1:20 showing that adequate depth is available in terms of the construction and long term viability of the green roof) and a programme for an initial scheme of maintenance, shall be submitted to and approved in writing by the local planning authority. The green roof shall be fully provided in accordance with the approved details prior to first occupation and thereafter retained and maintained in accordance with the approved scheme of maintenance.

Reason: To ensure that the green roof is suitably designed and maintained in accordance with the requirements of policies SD9, N5, B1 and B7 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006 and Camden Planning Guidance 2006.

4 Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3 of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 1995 as amended by the (No. 2) (England) Order 2008 or any Order revoking and re-enacting that Order, no development within Part 1 (Classes A-H) of Schedule 2 of that Order shall be carried out without the grant of planning permission having first been obtained from the Council.

Reason: To safeguard the amenities of surrounding residential properties and visual amenities of the area and to prevent over-development of the site by controlling proposed extensions and alterations in order to ensure compliance with the requirements of policies S1/ S2, B1, B7 and SD6 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

5 Before the first occupation of any of the new units the proposed cycle storage area hereby approved shall be provided in its entirety and thereafter permanently maintained and retained thereafter.

Reason: To ensure the development provides adequate cycle parking facilities in accordance with the requirements of policy T3 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

A 1.8 metre high screen, details of which shall have been submitted to and approved by the Council, shall be erected on the side of the proposed rear terrace of flat 1, prior to commencement of use of the roof terrace and shall be permanently retained and maintained thereafter.

Reason: In order to prevent unreasonable overlooking of neighbouring premises in accordance with the requirements of policies S1/S2 and SD6 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006

All trees on the site, or parts of trees growing from adjoining sites, unless shown on the permitted drawings as being removed, shall be retained and protected from damage to the satisfaction of the Council. Details shall be submitted to and approved by the Council before works commence on site to demonstrate how trees to be retained shall be protected during construction work: such details shall follow guidelines and standards set out in BS5837:2005 "Trees in Relation to Construction".

Reason: To ensure that the Council may be satisfied that the development will not have an adverse effect on existing trees and in order to maintain the character and amenities of the area in accordance with the requirements of policy N8 of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

- 3 Reasons for granting permission.
  - The proposed development is in general accordance with the policy requirements of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006, with particular regard to policies S1/S2, SD1, SD6, B1, B3, B7, H1, H7, N5, N8, T1, T3, T8, T9, R6 and R7. For a more detailed understanding of the reasons for the granting of this planning permission, please refer to the officers report.
- If a revision to the postal address becomes necessary as a result of this development, application under Part 2 of the London Building Acts (Amendment) Act 1939 should be made to the Council's Records and Information Team, Culture and Environment Directorate, Environment Department (Street Naming & Numbering) Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street, WC1H 8EQ (tel: 020-7974 5613).

- You are advised that this planning permission solely relates to the redevelopment of the site to provide two residential flats and a dwellinghouse and does not relate to change of use of the laundrette at the ground and basement floors commercial unit. Any change of use from Laundrette (Sui Generis) to a Shop (A1 use) here would require a separate planning permission.
- You are advised that policy H7 of the Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006 encourages all new housing developments to be accessible to all and meet "Lifetime Homes" standards, and the Council welcomes any measures that can be introduced to facilitate this. You are advised to consult the Access Officer, Camden Town Hall, Argyle Street WC1H 8EQ, (tel: 020-7974 2310) to ensure that the internal layout of the building is acceptable with regards to accessibility by future occupiers and their changing needs over time.
