Gentlemen,

12 APR 1938

The London Building Acts, 1930-1935.  
Site of 1 to 4, Willow Road, Hampstead.

With reference to your applications dated 23rd February and 15th March, 1938, and subsequent correspondence, I have been directed to intimate to you the Council's decision, which is as follows:-

That, on the application of Messrs. Goldfinger and Flower, in connection with the erection of a building (block of three dwelling houses) upon the site of 1 to 4, Willow Road, Hampstead, as shown on the plans (Nos. 31767 and 41158) (Applicant's Nos. 26, 27, 37 and 39) and particulars, the Council, under Section 9 of the London Building Act (Amendment) Act, 1935, do modify the requirements of By-law No. 39 made on the fourteenth day of December, 1937, so as to permit of openings in the external walls of such building of the area and width as shown on the said plans, subject to the following conditions:-

(1) that any additional work the District Surveyor may require for the purpose of securing strength or stability shall be executed to his satisfaction; and

(2) that the provisions of the London Building Acts, 1930 and 1935, and of the by-laws in force thereunder, shall be otherwise complied with to the satisfaction of the District Surveyor.

A copy of the said plans and particulars will be sent to Mr. B. Whyte, the District Surveyor, for his information, and this decision will also be intimated to him.

This notification does not relieve you of any obligation there may be to give the District Surveyor notice in respect of the works in question in accordance with the provisions of Section 161 of the London Building Act, 1930, and the London Building Act (Amendment) Act, 1935, and the by-laws in force thereunder.
