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Local housing operations - Parkhill Road site. Hampstead.

With reference to your letter of 5th July, 1946, I am directed to inform you that in pursuance of the Council's powers und the Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1946, permission is nereby granted to the erection by the Hampstead Metropolitan Borough Council of two blocks of flats at Parkhill Road as shown on drawings submitted (degd. No. 16077 - applicants' Nos. 2 subject to compliance with the provisions of the London Building Ac 1930-39, and by-laws in force therounder.

Approval is also given to the above-mentioned proposals fro a housing point of view, subject to the ecnditions attached to the town planning approval and to the prevision of:-

(1) adequate heating to one bedroom in each flat; if gas fires are installed they should be of the built-in type with flues: (2) adequate permanent ventilation to all bedrooms without

open fireplaces: (3) adequate lighting and ventilation to the internal corridors (a) of each flat (except two-room flats) by means of opening familiant over the living room door and one bedroom do as fur apart as possible and (b) to each meisonette by means d opening famliant over the bedroom door nearest the entrance;

(4) adequate natural lighting and ventilation to all lard and

(5) an adequate and satisfactory supply of not water to all dwellings.
