## REFUSAL OF PERMISSION TO DEVELOP

The Council, in pursuance of its powers under the above-mentioned Acts and Orders made hereunder, hereby refuses to permit the development referred to in the undermentioned Schedule as shown on the plans submitted.

Development: The erection of a four storey building for use as a service garage, stores

offices and a caretaker's flat at 24-26 Rousden Street, N.W.l

## Reasons for refusal:

- 1. The proposal involves a loss of residential accommodation and therefore conflicts with Section 17 of the Written Statement of the Initial Development Plan.
- 2. The proposed building would not accord with the zoning of the area in the Imitial Development Plan, in which the area is allocated for residential use.
- 3. The building would not comply with the Council's daylighting standards as set out in Planning Bulletin No. 5 published by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.
- to It is not considered appropriate on traffic grounds that access should be taken from Rousden Street, this being a residential street with a narrow carriageway.
