Town and Country Planning (General Interim Development) Order, 1946.  
84, Albert Street, St. Pancras.

With reference to your application dated 9th October, 1947, I am directed to inform you that the Council, in pursuance of its powers under the above-named Order, hereby permits a minor revision in the planning of the roof and welfare room at 84, Albert Street, St. Pancras, as shown on plan No. 7271 (your No. 275/47/2) as a variation from the plan No. 1803, which was approved for a period of fourteen years from 1st August, 1947, in respect of the above-named roof and welfare room, subject to the previous conditions of consent as intimated to you in letter dated 8th August, 1947, being otherwise complied with.

Your attention is invited to the provisions of the London Building Acts, 1930 to 1939, and the by-laws in force thereunder, which should be complied with to the satisfaction of the District Surveyor.
