Reason(s) for Refusal:

Ol It is considered that he use of the towpath as a main access to the wine bar would have a detrimental impact on the amenity of residential occupiers nearby and of the visitors to Camley Street Natural Park. It is also considered that use of the towpath as a main access could result in obstruction to the path.

02 It is considered that the elevational alterations harm the character and appearance of the arches and of this part of the Conservation Area by virtue of the covering of the original brickwork and the detailed

design.
