Pursuant to Condition (iv) of the planning permission issued by letter dated 13 November 1959 for the erection of buildings for use as offices, residential purposes, restaurant and shops at 93-111 New Oxford Street, 1-14 Earnshaw Street, 14-51 St. Giles' High Street, 1950-178 Charing Cross Road and 1-31 Lawrence Place, Helborn, the Council approves the details shown on drawings Regd. No. 19829 (Your drawings Nos. 320/60c-76c (even Numbers only), 320/213c and 320/228) and indicated in your latter dated 11 December 1962, in so far as details of the elevations of the tower block, facing materials to be used thereon, and revised plans of the thirty-second and thirty-third floors are concerned.

 - (b) the layout of the servicing area at ground floor level on drawing No. 320/64c.
- (3) Of the necessity of submitting an application under Section 51 of the London Building Act, 1930.
