- after the war. Both houses were converted into flats, with three flats to each house.
- 16. No. 3 Mill Lane was 'taken out of rating', presumably having been demolished, in September 1989.
- 17. In summary, this site was historically part of a large estate and was developed by the building of speculative houses under building leases in the normal manner of such urban landholdings. The houses built on the site were substantial houses and well occupied. The area of ground in the middle of the site was occupied at least in the 1930s by a nursery with access from Mill Lane. As a result of the outbreak of the Second World War, the houses were vacated. Nos 5 and 7 Mill Lane were demolished in 1941. The remaining three houses were unoccupied at the end of the war. No 23 Minster Road was demolished in 1951. Nos 1 and 3 Mill Lane were converted into flats, possibly by Hampstead Borough Council. No. 3 Mill Lane was demolished in 1989.
