The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed access arrangements do not achieve level and inclusive access for



all. The details are therefore unsatisfactory and are contrary to policies SD1c (quality of life) and B1 (design principles) of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

Informative(s):

- 1 This submission only relates to the north eastern section of the site containing the Sunday school and nursery building.
- 2 You are advised that details relating to condition 6 (tree planting), condition 10 (tree protection method statement), condition 11 (internal lighting), condition 12 (access for people with disabilities), condition 14 (ventilation) and condition 15 (bicycle storage) remain outstanding and require details to be submitted to the local planning authority for consideration.
