### Site Description

### Assessment

The proposal is for a standard ATM with internally illuminated signage above the machine itself. It will be located in the righthand glazed panel of the shopfront on the left hand frontage of the double unit; the stallriser and fanlight above will be retained.

The scheme is considered acceptable- the shopfronts of this unit are modern and of little intrinsic merit; the essential features of the shopfront framework will be retained, and 3 glazed panes will be retained within the left hand shopfront after the insertion of this ATM. The machine will comply with DDA requirements for disabled access and will not present any community safety issues. The advert sign "Cash", dimensioned 650 x 400mm, is discreet and appropriately located. Given the mixed nature of this shopping parade with a variety of signage, this is considered appropriate and will not harm visual amenity of public safety.

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
