The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** listed building consent for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed basement stair, replacement front door, alterations to the corridor and rear courtyard area at ground floor level, insertion of new internal lightwell, new opening at first floor level and alterations to the fireplaces, by reason of the loss of



original form and historic fabric, would be harmful to the special architectural and historic interest of the building contrary to policy B6 (Listed Buildings) of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.

Informative(s):

In the event of any resubmission, you are advised that the floorplans and sections should correlate and correspond with respect to the basement stair and that all windows and doors are shown on the drawings as those at rear ground floor level are not represented. Details would also need to be submitted to show how the rear first floor extension would abut the rear wall, together with details of any structural upgrading and power runs through the building.

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
