Assessment

Two advertisement panels would be displayed on the outer (facing the traffic) elevation of the bus shelter. Each would measure 1760mm x 1160mm and form an integral part of the bus shelter. The poster panels would be illuminated by static-white fluorescent tubes.

The shelter is not in a sensitive location, it is in front of buildings of no particular architectural value. Therefore the use of two panels for the display of advertisements would not harm the setting of local buildings or character and appearance of the conservation area.

The adverts would not create a diversion to drivers to the extent that an accident would be likely. Therefore no concerns on the grounds of public safety.

The application complies with the Council's Crime Prevention Design Advisor who suggested that only one elevation is used for advertising, the back screen or the two ends. In this case both ends of the shelter would be clear allowing clear views in, thereby limiting opportunities for criminal or anti-social behaviour.

The proposal complies with UDP - SD1D, B4B and planning guidance.
