The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed solid roller shutters, by reason of their design and external appearance, would be incongruous additions to the building, detrimental to the character and appearance of the building and the wider Hatton Garden Conservation Area, contrary to policies B1 'General design principles', B4a 'Shopfronts' and B7 'Conservation Areas' of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006.



Informative(s):

Without prejudice to any future planning application or appeal, you are advised that roller grilles are preferable to solid shutters as they provide security without obscuring windows and allow views of the interior, which enhances surveillance and security. Additionally, all grilles and shutters should have an acceptable finish i.e coloured (painted, powder coated or stove enamelled) to match the colours of the windows on the property.

Your attention is drawn to the notes attached to this notice which tell you about your Rights of Appeal and other information.
