Assessment

The existing shopfront is not original. It has a central entrance with two panes of glass either side, and a very small stallriser; this "frame" will remain, and the new ATM will be installed within it, on the southernmost pane of glass. It will have a painted metal frame. The key issues are:

- It is located at a height that means it will be accessible for wheelchair users
- It has a relatively wide [3.8m] pavement in front of it, so its use should not cause any obstruction to pedestrian movement
- It will be highly visible, and thus should not lead to an increase in crime or the fear of crime this is confirmed by the Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Design Advisor
- It is considered acceptable in design terms it will not adversely affect the appearance of the building and it is consistent with CPG principles.

Recommendation: Grant permission
