Proposal:

Erection of a three-storey lift shaft with turret roof on the Chesterford Gardens elevation to facilitate access to two self-contained flats at second and third floor level. Drawing Nos: L(PL)RR/30; 31; 32; 33; 34; 35; 36; 40; 41; 42; 43; 44; 45; 46.

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed lift shaft, by reason of its excessive height and bulk, and its incongruous location and roof form, would be detrimental to the appearance of the building and the character and appearance of the Conservation Area, contrary to policies B1 (General design principles), B3 (Alterations and extensions) and B7 (Conservation areas) of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006 and to guidance contained within Camden Planning Guidance 2006 and the Redington/Frognal Conservation Area Statement.

1 You are advised that measures that facilitate easy access to and within buildings is encouraged by policies SD1C and H7 of the Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006 and that alternative locations for the provision of a lift within the envelope of the existing building would be welcomed.
