The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed new casement and sash windows on the front and rear elevations, by reason of their inappropriate design in terms of proportions, profiles, glazing pattern and materials, would be detrimental to the appearance of the building, the setting of the neighbouring buildings and the character and appearance of the conservation area, contrary to policies S1,2,7 (strategic policies), B1 (design principles) and B3



(alterations and extensions) of the London Borough of Camden Replacement Unitary Development Plan 2006, and to design advice in the Camden Planning Guidance 2006 and the Swiss Cottage Conservation Area Statement.
