## SENATE HOUSE, UNIVERSITY OF LONDON

Please find enclosed a listed building consent application for 'Enabling Works' to Senate House.

The south block is to undergo a substantial refurbishment programme to secure its long term future in academic use and comply with Health and Safety Regulations. This application forms part of the 'Enabling Works' that have to be undertaken in advance of the refurbishment. As discussed with yourself and Victoria Fowlis, the majority of the Enabling Works do not require the benefit of listed building consent.

This application concerns the creation of:

- new basement trenches; and
- riser enclosures in various locations.
