Town and Country Planning Act, 1947 - Section 16:  
Appeal relating to Parliament Court, Parliament  
Hill, Hampstead.

I am directed by the Minister of Housing and Local Government to say that he has considered the report of his Inspector, Mr. A.C. Box, M.I.Mun.E., following the local inquiry into the appeal by Mr. G.E. Jacobs against the London County Council's refusal to permit the use of the basement of Parliament Court, Parliament Hill, Hampstead, for light industrial or warehouse purposes, on the grounds that the proposed uses are inappropriate and undesirable and likely to be detrimental to the flats above.

The Minister has carefully considered the facts of this case and the representations made at the Inquiry, and he finds himself in agreement with the Council's decision for the reasons given by them.

Accordingly, the Minister has decided to dismiss the appeal and this letter is issued as his formal decision.
