Conservation Area Consent

CONSENT OR CONSERVATION AREA CONSENT, OR GRANT OF CONSENT SUBJECT TO
CONDITIONS.

1) If the applicant is aggrieved by the decision of the local planning
authority to refuse listed building consent or conservation area
consent for the proposed works, or to grant consent subject to con-
ditions, the applicant may appeal to the Secretary of State for the
Environment in accordance with Sections 20 & 21 of the Planning (Listed
Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990 within six months of receipt
of this notice. (Appeals must be made on a form which is obtainable
from the Department of the Environment, Tollgate House, Houlton Street,
Bristol, BS2 9DJ).

The Secretary of State has power to allow a longer period for the giving
of notice of appeal but he will not normally be prepared to exercise
this power unless there are special circumstances which excuse the
delay in giving notice of appeal.
