Dear Sir,

Town and Country Planning Act, 1947.
Town and Country Planning
General Development Order, 1950.

With reference to your letter of 26th November, 1950, I am directed to inform you, with regard to the permission granted under the Town and Country Planning General Development Order, 1950, in respect of the development at the premises, No. 10, Newland Street, Holborn, as shown on the plan (No. 11601 - Your Ref. 2/444/4 and 3/444/2) submitted, the Council, in pursuance of its powers under the above-named Order, hereby modifies the terms of its permission including condition (a) so as to read:-

"For a limited period, the reinstatement and alterations to No. 10, Herbrand Street, Holborn, and the erection of a lift structure on part of the adjoining site at No. 8, in connection with the use as a typewriter service depot, subject to:-

The limited period for the use and the retention of the alterations and lift structure being fourteen years from 1st June, 1950, at the expiration of which period such work shall be removed, and the use herein aforesaid shall be discontinued, without compensation, unless the Council shall have previously approved retention of the works and continuance of the use for a further period; ;

subject also to compliance otherwise with the terms of its permission dated 22nd November, 1950.
