The redevelopment of the sites of Nos. 201-207, Gray's Diamonth and Nos. 1-5, Heathcote Street, St. Paneras, by the erection of a Nurses' home comprising 48 bed-sitting rooms on four upper floors and car park, etc., below.

: (1) The height of the block as proposed is excessive, having regard to the height of existing and proposed development in Resease to the term

(2) The development as proposed is unsatisfactory in that the concentration of building on the Gray's Inn Read frontage results in the rest of adjoining premises being visible from Mecklenburgh Square which would be detrimental to the architectural conception composed of the buildings in Necklenburgh Square and Necklenburgh Street, many of which are listed buildings of Architectural or Historic Interest.
