Permission for Development

#### SCHEDULE

Date of Original Application : 20th August 1985

Proposal : Change of use and works of conversion to form six self-contained dwelling units within the existing building including minor alterations to the external appearance, and the erection of a two-storey rear extension comprising two dwellings, including the provision of 2 off-street parking spaces and formation of a means of access to the highway, as shown on drawing nos. 06.112.01a, 02, 03a, 04, 05a, 06a 07A, and 4 survey drawings, revised on 6th and 11th November 1985.

#### Standard Condition:

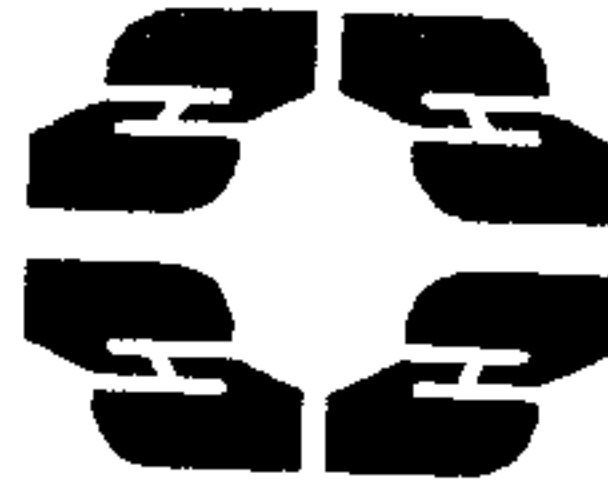
1. The development hereby permitted must be begun not later than the expiration of five years from the date on which this permission is granted.

#### Reason for Standard Condition:

1. In order to comply with the provisions of Section 41 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

#### Additional Condition(s):

- 01 The facing materials to be used on the extension/~~building~~ shall not be otherwise than as shall have been submitted to and approved by the Council before any work on the site is commenced.

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- 02 No development shall take place until full details of hard and soft landscaping and means of enclosure of all unbuilt, open areas have been submitted to and approved by the Council.
- 03 All trees on the site, unless shown on the permitted drawings as being removed, shall be retained and protected to the satisfaction of the Council until 12 months following completion of the development hereby approved. Any trees removed without consent or dying or being severely damaged or becoming seriously diseased during that period shall be replaced as soon as is reasonably possible and, in any case, by not later than the end of the following planting season, with trees of such size and species and in such positions as may be agreed with the Council.
- 04 Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 3 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 as amended, or any Order revoking and re-enacting that Order, no development within Class I and II of Schedule I of that Order shall be carried out without the grant of planning permission having first been obtained from the Council.

Reason(s) for Additional Condition(s):

- 01 To ensure that the Council may be satisfied with the external appearance of the building.
- 02 In order that the Council may give consideration to the details of the proposed development.
- 03 To ensure that the Council may be satisfied that the development will not have an adverse effect on existing trees and in order to maintain the character and amenities of the area.
- 04 To safeguard the visual amenities of the area and to prevent over-development of the site by controlling proposed extensions and alterations.
