Such use does not accord with the Administrative County of London Developm ont Plan in which this area is allocated for residential purposes with a shopping frontage, and involves a loss of residential accommodation, contrary to the provisions of Section 16 of the Written Statement of the Development Plan which states "Throughout the county, permission (temporary or permanent) will not, except in very special circumstances, be given for a change from residential use of any residenti 1 building which can still be used, with or without adaptation, for residential purposes of any kind. purposes of any kind."
