I am directed by the Minister of Town and Country Planning to say that he has considered the report of his Inspector, Mr. R.A. Youll, M.C., M.I.Mun.R., following the local inquiry into your appeal against the London County Council's refusal to permit the continued use of the basement of No. 117, Albert Street, St. Pancras for the purpose of tailoring workrooms.

The Minister has considered the representations of the parties concerned and all the relevant facts of this case and has come to the conclusion that he would not be justified in reversing the Council's decision.
