To ensure that the Council shall be satisfied as to the details of the bricks to be used.

I have to inform you that the first, second and third floors of No.14, Red Lion Square and the third floor of No.15, Red Lion Square appear to have use rights for single-family residential purposes only and not office use rights as stated in your form of application for planning permission. A further application for planning permission should be made before any of these floors are used for office purposes and, in view of the Council's present policy of retaining residential accommodation in the central areas, it is unlikely that permission would be granted.
