Subordinate rapidly growing lateral branches

Remove poorly attached branches

Remove dead and broken branches

Remove lowest branches

Prune Purple Leaf Plum (ID 4) located at the side of the house according to the following specifications:

Thin crown to remove approximately 15% of live branches to reduce crown density. Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Prune the following property items:

Birch (ID 5) located at the back of the property

Birch (ID 6) located at the back of the property

Cherry (ID 7) located at the back of the property according to the following specifications:

Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Winter Flowering Cherry (ID 8) located at the back of the property according to the following specifications:

Reduce branch by approximately 1-1.5 metres to growing through trellis.
