Replacement of front entrance and surround to offices (Class B1a).

The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** planning permission for the following reason(s):

## Reason(s) for Refusal

The proposed loss of the existing arched entrance bay and its replacement by the aluminium glazed entrance screen, would harm the special architectural and historic interest of the listed building and undermine the character and appearance of the Charlotte Street Conservation Area, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP25 (Conserving Camden's



- heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework.
- The siting of the proposed entrance doors and the reconfigured entrance arrangement fails to improve standards of access and inclusion, contrary to policy CS14 (Promoting high quality places and conserving our heritage) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policy DP29 (Improving access) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework.
