The Council has considered your application and decided to **refuse** a certificate of lawfulness for the following reason:

Insufficient evidence has been submitted to demonstrate that on the balance of probability, the first, second and third floors has been used as 6 non-self contained residential units which form part of an HMO (Class C4) for a continuous period of 10 or more years.
