## Proposal:

Variation of condition 3 (approved drawings) of planning permission granted on 06/11/2013 (ref: 2013/3231/P for the redevelopment to provide 16 residential units and 545 sgm of ground floor and basement retail space (2 x Class A1 units.), namely the increase of 32sqm in floorspace of retail unit B at ground floor level and relocation of cycle parking facilities to the basement floor level.

The Council has considered your application and decided to refuse planning permission for the following reason(s):

Reason(s) for Refusal

1 The proposed cycle parking facility, by virtue of its location, access provision and



basement floor level, is both inadequate and inconvenient and is likely to discourage use, failing to comply with policy CS11 (Promoting sustainable and efficient travel) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Core Strategy and policies DP17 (Walking, cycling and public transport) and DP18 (Parking standards and limiting the availability of car parking) of the London Borough of Camden Local Development Framework Development Policies.

In dealing with the application, the Council has sought to work with the applicant in a positive and proactive way in accordance with paragraphs 186 and 187 of the National Planning Policy Framework.
