E.g. Oak (T3) - fell because of excessive shading and low amenity value. Replant with 1 standard ash in the same place.

Rear Garden

Row of Cork Oak: Rear Boundary - Approximately 5m. Reduce height by between 15-20% to a more formal tree/hedge line. Remove dead wood throughout crown. Reasons - These fine trees appear to be generally in good condition although growth rate and vigour varies between individual specimens. Some light pruning works will no doubt induce stronger reactionary re-growth. Pruning the trees to a more equal height will also allow the more slower growing and suppressed trees to flourish whilst enhancing aesthetic value and promoting a more even and full screen as the tree line height progresses.

Cork Oak: Adjacent table. Approximately 4-5m. Tree appears in good health. Reduce crown by 15-20%, remove dead wood and thin crown density by 20%. This action will give better clearance for umbrella whilst preserving a balanced and healthy crown structure.

Robinia - Carry out visual climbing inspection, carry out any remedial pruning on storm damaged limbs and remove dead wood throughout crown. Reason - This mature tree is a key feature within the garden. Its age and condition necessitate regular maintenance.

Birch: Approximately 8m. Thin crown density by 20% and remove dead wood. This tree has been regularly pruned. This work will need to be carried out on a separate visit in winter months.

Front Garden - Acer: Located front of window. Judiciously reduce height by approximately 15% in order to increase light levels and control growth habit whilst preserving screen, natural characteristics and aesthetic value.
