Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 1.5-2 metres to reduce risk of branch or stem failure.

Prune Field Maple (ID 3) located at the South Boundary of Tennis Courts - Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 102 metres to provide clearance to fence. Prune Purple Leaf Plum group (ID 21) located next to Tennis courts - reduce crown height and spread by approximately 1-1.5 metres to provide clearance to fence.

Prune Sycamore (ID 1) located at the side of Tennis courts - Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 1-1.5 metres to provide clearance to fence.

Prune Elm (ID 17) located adjacent to (ID 16) - reduce crown height and spread by approximately 102 metres to contain.

Prune English Oak (ID 16) located at the Front Boundary - Reduce crown height and spread by approximately 1-1.5 metres to reduce risk of branch stem and/or root failure. Prune Norway Maple (ID 15) located at the front boundary according to the following specifications:

Thin crown to remove approximately 20% of live branches to reduce crown density. Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve healt hand appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Prune Lime (ID 13) located at the front boundary according to the following specifications:

clean to remove all dead, diseased and broken branches 2 centimetres in diameter and larger throughout crown to improve health and appearance and reduce risk of branch failure.

Thin crown to remove approximately 20% of live branches to reduce crown density. Most thinning cuts will be between 2 and 3 centimetres in diameter.

Prune Ivy, Laurel, Holly and forsythia group (ID 11) located at the Corridor at rear of block and trim to maintain desired shape.
